1. University of Calicut

The University of Calicut is the largest university in Kerala. Established in the year 1968, it is the second university to be set up in Kerala. The University aims to nurture excellence in education and research in its catchment areas of Northern Kerala, historically consigned to the periphery of Kerala's academic map. The university lay its emphasis on fostering quality human resource and promoting productive research that benefit both local communities and wider humanity.

The university was created through a Government plan bifurcating Kerala University. As per the plan, the four post graduate departments of the university of Kerala operating in Calicut were annexed to the new university along with 54 constituent colleges spread across seven northern districts. With 'Nirmaya Karmana Sree' as it's motto, the university has been able to surmount all challenges and emerge as the largest residential cum affiliating University in Kerala. With 30 post graduate departments and 480 colleges it has become a beacon of hope and enlightenment for hundreds of thousands of young men and women in North Kerala.

The university campus, located a Thehnipalam,24 km south of Calicut is the main hub of academic activities. Situated here besides the 28 post graduate teaching and research departments are: the Vice chancellors Office, the Administration block, Pareeksha Bhavan, School of Distance education, Academic Staff College, educational and Multimedia Research Centre, Computer Centre, and the University Library. The departments on the campus include Arabic,Botany, Biotechnology, Centre for women studies, Chemistry, Commerce & Management studies,Computer Science, Education,English, Hindi, history, West Asian Studies, Mass Communication & Journalism,Life Science,Life long Learning & Extension, Malayalam and Kerala Studies, Mathematics, Nano science and Technology,Philosophy,Physics, Physical Education,Psychology,Russian & Centre for comparative literature,Sanskrit, school of folklore Studies, Statistics and Zoology.

2. The School of Distance Education

The School of Distance education, formerly known as the 'Institute of Correspondence Courses and Continuing Education, University of Calicut, started functioning in the Academic year 1981-82. Now it is one of the major Departments of the university and has also emerged as one of the major distance education providers. School of Distance Education is making all its effort to extend its support

to reach the unreached and has been keen in providing facilities in distance mode for the benefit of the deprived sections of the society.

It caters to the needs of thousands of students from various parts of the country. School of Distance Education, University of Calicut now runs 14 Under Graduate Programmes and 12 Post Graduate Programmes.

3. Details of the proposed BA philosophy programme

3.1 Programme's mission & objective

Understanding the nature of philosophical enquiry, how philosophy as a discipline can deal with wide variety of human concerns. - Students have the ability to critically evaluate by the methods provided in the curriculum to situations they explore.
- Students are made to think through themselves of the philosophical arguments and problems.

3.2 Relevance of the program with HEI's mission and goals

Offered in the distance mode, BA philosophy will be closely aligned with the vision and mission of the University of Calicut, in vowing to ensure knowledge based, student focused, quality and cost conscious but socially responsible education.

BA philosophy in the distance mode will be a feeder programme for the MA Philosophy programmes offered by the university, and it follows moreover the same syllabus of the programme offered in the regular mode through the affiliated colleges of the University of Calicut.

3.3 Nature of prospective target group of learners

To cater to the needs of society at large, no one who aspire to reach the heights of wisdom should be left alone, society has the responsibility take them ashore by providing adequate resources and infrastructure. In the field of education those responsibilities are taken up by the open and distance learning mode (ODL). University of Calicut (SDE) has been catering to the needs education of persons coming from diverse strata of society.

The Philosophical language can be tapped in for employment related to advertising,Law firms,Journalism,Public relations etc.

- Persons who are employed in professions that require creative bent of linguistic expression like advertisement, public relations and who aspire to hone their skills will certainly get an opportunity by the way of distance education programmes.

3.5 Instructional Design

BA philosophy programme has been approved by the statutory bodies of the University. The syllabus is designed in such a way that best learning experience is possible for students. Academic staff and experts in the area of Philosophy propose changes in the curriculum and syllabus at certain intervals and notify it to the board of studies in Philosophy of the university when and so required for the final approval.

3.5.4 Faculty and support staff requirement:

There is two full time faculty member available in Philosophy. One for BA programme and one for MA programme. Supporting staff from the School of Distance Education are performing the administrative functioning for all the programs. The service of qualified guest teachers and experts from panels approved by the Vice Chancellor are used in preparation of study materials, for taking contact classes and conducting internal evaluation.

3.5.5 Instructional delivery mechanism:

The academic contents are being delivered to the students through study learning materials and contact classes as stipulated by norms of the Distance Education Programme. Normally, contact classes are held as per a schedule drawn beforehand by the Study Centre Coordinator. They are held on weekends. Eminent teachers from School of Distance Education and other institutes drive these classes with their vast experience and help the learners to understand the subject better.

3.6.6 Evaluation:

Evaluation is by end semester examinations. End Semester Examinations are conducted by the Controller of Examinations, University of Calicut. Of the 100 marks per paper the external examination carry 80 marks. The examiners for evaluation are drawn from the panel of examiners available for the corresponding disciplines in the regular mode.
