Mission and Vision

In the 50th anniversary of the university, School of Distance Education, University of Calicut, work towards broadening its social base and ensuring quality higher education to all. Since the programme BA Sociology is the one of the most demanded program in the Malabar region it aims to familiarize the students with the key sociological concepts. And emphasize the significance of sociological imaginations in understanding the contemporary society. In the undergraduate level, program aims to broaden learners' world views and their perspective. In 2014 admission onwards university introduced Choice Based Credit Semester System (CUCBCSS) to improve the quality of the admission system.

Objectives of the Programme

- Identify the main concerns of social science disciplines.
- To learn to apply the methods and theories of social sciences to contemporary issues.
- To identify the nature and characteristics of social processes.
- To provide a sociological perspective for understanding the dynamics of Indian Society.
- To analyse the changes occurred in the various institutions in Indian Society.
- To familiarize with Anthropological studies in India by focusing on Tribal Communities in the country in general and in the state of Kerala in particular.

Relevance of the program with HEI's Mission and Goals:

To fulfill the vision and mission of the University of Calicut, the programme BA Sociology will ensure socially relevant, student centered quality and cost conscious education for all sections of the society. It also works towards making university a space accessible to all session of the people irrespective of their cast, class, and economic status.

BA Sociology in the distance mode will be a feeder programme for the MA Sociology programme offered by the university, and it follows the same syllabus and curriculum of the programme offered in the regular mode through the affiliated colleges of the University of Calicut.

Nature of prospective target group of learners:

In the Malabar region the discipline of Sociology has wide demand. Though, the number of eat available in the regular college are proportionately very small and only a small percentage of the students are being accommodated in the regular mode through colleges. The current programme will make an attempt to democratising higher education to large segments of the population, providing an innovative system of university level education that is flexible and open in terms of methods, pace of learning, eligibility for enrolment and age of entry.

By considering the target group of learners' nature we have structured our syllabus and learning material. It helps the learners to acquire the threshold of higher education, and lead them through the course of the programme and the final evaluation.

Specific Skills and Competence to be Acquire:

The BA Sociology programme will see to ensure the following skills and competences in the learners.

Faculty and support staff requirement: There are two faculty members available and one of them coordinates the BA Programme in Sociology. There is sufficient staff support from the SDE office for processing administrative work. The service of qualified teachers and experts from panels approved by the Vice Chancellor are used in the preparation of SLM, for taking contact classes and conducting internal evaluation.

Instructional delivery mechanisms: In addition to providing Self Learning Material, students are offered 60 contact hours each semester, conducted over 10 days during the weekend. Classes are taken using audio visual aids, and students are encouraged to use authentic web resources from genuine sites.

Procedure for admissions: Application is to be submitted online. Candidates should submit the printout of the application form along with the required documents at the School of Distance Education. 1st Year tuition fee is to be remitted at the time of application and IIInd year/IIIrd year tuition fee is to be remitted after the completion of 2nd/4th semester examinations/before the commencement of 3rd/5th semester. Admission is made through the purely online process, Fee should be remitted by Online through the Instant Web Payment utility provided in the University Website.

University notifies its various policies for the programme delivery along with the details of methods and web-based tools to be adopted in the official website. All notification regarding all the academic activities to be carried out by the University during the academic session is provided in the official website and through the Study Centres where the counseling is offered. Further, the University notifies all notification, assignment, question papers, result and other related information to examination and evaluation through it official website.

Financial Assistance: Candidates belonging to SC/ST/OEC are eligible for concession from payment of tuition fees, only if they are not employed in Govt./Quasi Govt./Public Sector

services. They should submit the duly filled in application form (available in the SDE website) for fee concession with relevant documents at the time of admission. No fee concession for OBC students. Blind candidates are also eligible for fee concession on production of Medical Certificate.

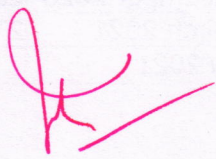
