1. University of Calicut

The University of Calicut is the largest University in Kerala. Established in the year 1968, it is the second university to be set up in Kerala. The University aims to nurture excellence in education and research in its catchment areas of Northern Kerala, historically consigned to the periphery of Kerala's academic map. The University lays its emphasis on fostering quality human resource and promoting productive research that benefit both local communities and wider humanity.

With 'Nirmaya Karmana Sree' as it motto, the University has been able to surmount all challenges and emerge as the largest residential cum affiliating University in Kerala. With 30 post graduate departments and 480 colleges it has become a beacon of hope and enlightenment for hundreds of thousands of young men and women in North Kerala. Besides restructuring the graduate and post-graduate courses, the University has introduced integrated M.Phil/Ph.D programmes from 2004-05 academic years. Apart from the regular mode, Calicut University offers courses in distance mode.

To meet the demand for trained personnel in emerging areas, the University has launched new programmes in computer application & information technology, health sciences, fashion design, social work, printing technology, computer hardware and automobile engineering. Yet another effort in this direction is the establishment of the University Institute of Engineering Technology on the main campus. The Institute offers B.Tech courses in electronics and communication, printing technology, electrical and electronics and IT streams.

Administration through E-Governance and computerisation of University examination to become the first digital University in Kerala, establishment of smart class rooms and modernization of laboratories, frontier lectures by renowned scholars and scientists, are the other recent initiatives. University of Calicut is conferred with the distinction of A grade in the recent NAAC accreditation.

2. The School of Distance Education

The School of Distance Education, formerly known as the 'Institute of Correspondence Courses and Continuing Education', University of Calicut, started functioning in the Academic year 1981-82. Now it is one of the major Departments of the university and has also emerged as one of the major distance education providers. SDE is making all its effort to extend its support to reach the unreached and has been keen in providing facilities in distance mode for the benefit of the deprived sections of the society. It caters to the needs of thousands of students from various parts of the country. The aims and objectives of the school include:

• Providing distance learning opportunities to the unreached and enable them to pursue quality higher education leading to competence of a high order.

• Providing an efficient and flexible system of education to meet the access and equality, and work towards development of a knowledge society.

• Providing quality education to the disadvantaged groups like those living in remote and rural areas, working people, and women.

SDE got the UGC recognition to offers 14 UG and 12 PG programmes from the academic year 2017-18 onwards. At present we have 20 Assistant professors on contact for running the distance education programmes.

3. Details of the proposed B A English Programme

a) Programme's mission and objectives:

3.1 mission and Objectives

In keeping with the overall mission of the School of Distance Education, University of Calicut, to ensure accessibility of quality higher education to all, the programme B A English Language and Literature aims at imparting knowledge in English literature, and skills in using English language in the undergraduate level.

3.2 Relevance of the programme with HEI's Mission and Goals:

Offered in distance mode, B A English Programme will enable students, particularly those who could not join regular colleges or universities owing to social, economic and other constraints, to understand English language and Literature with the support of various learning support facilities.

BA English in the distance mode will be a feeder programme for the MA English programmes offered by the University , and it follows the same syllabus and curriculum of the programme offered in the regular mode through the affiliated colleges of the University of Calicut.

3.3 Nature of prospective target group of learners

English language has been growing importance in this globalized world. B A Programme in English Language and literature has wide demand and only a small percentage of the students are being accommodated in the regular mode through colleges. Moreover, as an attempt to democratize the higher education to a large segment of population, Calicut University offers this programme in distance mode.

For this purpose, we have structured our learning material and induction programmes to lead the fresh learners through the threshold of higher education, and lead them through the course of the programme and the final evaluation.

3.4 Appropriateness of programme to be conducted in open and Distance Learning mode to acquire specific skills and competence

The B A English programme offered in distance mode enables pupils who are unable to pursue university education as full time candidate for various reasons, since the course design, study materials, duration of the Programme and contact classes have been arranged to suit their convenience. A solid foundation in English language and literature helps the candidates progress in their respective careers. Moreover, the syllabus of the Programme covers the whole gamut of concerns in the literary studies. The student undergoing this course is sure to acquire a comprehensive understanding of literary theory, criticism, translation, world literatures and issues of social concern like the environment. In that respect it also enables one to become a diligent citizen endowed with a sensibility attuned to the concerns of the world.

3.5 Instructional Design

The B A English programme proposed here is also offered by the university through regular mode. Also the programme has been approved by the board of studies of Calicut University. We have created a panel of experts to prepare study materials and question papers. The candidates will be supplied with study materials from time to time and will be required to attend the contact classes regularly. More over we have uploaded all the study materials, question banks and other learning aids in the website of Calicut University.

3.5.4 Faculty and support staff requirement

There is only one full time faculty member available and we have appointed a programme coordinator in each study centres of SDE.the service of qualified guest teachers and expert panels approved by the university are used in the preparation of SLM for taking contact classes and conducting evaluation.

3.5.5 Instructional delivery mechanisms

In addition to providing SLMs prepared in line with the UGC guidelines on preparation of SLMs, students are being offered 55 to 70 contact hours for each semester. The personal contact Programmes are being taken using audio visual aids, and students are encouraged to use web resources to prepare personal notes, videos etc.

3.5.6 Student Support Service Systems at SDE

The SDE establishes Learner Support Centres for the students at different locations within the jurisdiction of the University to facilitate contact classes and practical sessions.

WE have set up a library with 4024 books and journals at the head quarter of SDE for references. Reference service of the Calicut University Central Library (C.H. Mohammed Koya Library) in the Campus and Service of Library at the University Study Centers are also offered.

Hand Book - provides General information about the institution, Courses and facilities offered, Overview of the various UG, PG, Professional/job-oriented and Certificate courses, Admission procedures & Re- admission, Academic Instructions, Rules and regulations and details of University Examinations & Fee structure.

Academic Calendar - SDE introduced a permanent academic calendar for its courses which ensures systematic performance and time bound completion of courses.

Website – The main form of information Dissemination which include Notifications & Information, Online Registration & ID Card, Contact Class schedule, Syllabus, Study Materials and Question Bank.

3.6 Procedure for admissions, curriculum transaction and evaluation:

3.6.1 Admission

The admission notifications for B.A English Programme, among others are being issued in leading national and regional dailies during June-July. The detailed information regarding admission is being given on the SDE website and on the admission website. Students seeking admission shall apply online.

3.6.2 Minimum Eligibility for Admission

Students who have successfully completed their higher secondary education in any stream are eligible to apply for this, provided:

(a) they have studied a minimum of three papers in English (b) they have scored a minimum of 45% marks in the subject. Eligible concessions in marks will be given to those who submit relevant documents

Computer Lab is not mandatory for BA Programme. SDE has its own library facility with a total of about 4024 books, 1165 titles, 144 reference titles. Further, all the students of the School of Distance Education can make use of the reference service of the Calicut University Central Library (C.H. Mohammed Koya Library) in the Campus. Graduates of the Calicut University are eligible to get membership of the Central Library. They can also make use of the Library at the University Study Centre located at P.T. Usha Road, Calicut.

The Calicut University Library, established in 1971 and later renamed after C.H.Mohammed Koya, (the former Minister for Education, Government of Kerala), is primarily concerned with the conservation and dissemination of knowledge to its users. It plays an important role in the provision of information to the academic community in the Malabar region. The library has a rich collection of Books, Journals, Maps, CDs, Theses, Dissertations etc. The collection includes 107948 books and about 2500 back volumes of journals. Library follows the Anglo American cataloguing Rules II (with slight modifications) for Cataloguing and Dewey Decimal Scheme of Classification for the classification of books. It has the distinction of being the first fully automated University Library in the state of Kerala.

The activities of the Library are comprehensively automated using open source library management software KOHA. OPAC, Journal Article Index, Bi-monthly Bibliography compilation and Literature Search Service are also available The library is a member of the INFLIBNET Centre, Ahmedabad as well as & DELNET (Developing Library Network). As a member of these networks, the library provides access to the resources of other major libraries in the country. In addition to the access to UGC INFONET consortium, it has access to major online databases, such as EBSCO, ProQuest dissertations and theses, Oxford Scholarship Online, IEEE All Society Periodicals Package etc.
